

THIRD TEAM REPORT 1984 - 1985

At the time of writing the Third Team still has a number of games to play and the wins (II) stand greater than losses (8), the number of games played a respectable 24, although nine fixtures were lost mid - season due to a combination of inclement weather and opposition failing to appear on the day. So on reflection not a bad season at all, but like all seasons with both its high and low spots.

The high spots that stand out are the passing of the ten win landmark (a new record) and that number crops up again with what must be a Third Team record victory (that even including pre-match kick-ins) a IO-O thrashing of Shhhhh you know who on the 4th November. A win made even more interesting by the fact that we took 25 minutes to score and could have been 2 down by that time, had not our stalwart full-back cleared two certain goals off the line with the despairing Gaghan hopelessly stranded (modesty prevents me from naming this defending hero). By contrast our post christmas run of bad results culminating with four defeats in a row in March took the shine off early season form, however the collapse can cite the long lay-off as prime cause of this, (or so the theory goes).

Another disappointment was our failure yet again to get the better of Luton Round Table losing I-4 and drawing 2-2 the latter being an excellent hard fought encounter. Match of the season was without doubt a fine 3-I victory in Stevenage on I4th October against a young (under 30) fit (could run length of pitch in one go) side, where keeper Gaghan performed miracles, and we scored with the three strikes at goal we were allowed. It took a splendid Moreton own goal (not his last) to put them onto the scoresheet. Indeed Goal of the Season must go to Steve, who, with the last kick of the match and the score at 5-4 in our favour volleyed superbly home against Oaklands in our 5-5 draw.

To conclude I would like to thank all who have turned out for the Thirds this season and Phil Charles for his services at our home games. I hope that you all have an enjoyable summer and will be ready for the 85-86 season this coming August.





I do not wish to appeal against the referee's decision, but I wish to submit this letter as a form of explanation.

In brief, I have played 'League' football at most levels for twenty three years, since the age of fourteen, during which time I have once been 'booked' for tripping an opponent.

Regarding the referee's report on my caution, I wish to suggest that there were mitigating circumstances. The referee showed no sign of questioning or punishing bad tackles in what can be described as a normal, hard-tackling but fair Sunday morning fixture. Before the described incident had taken place I was repeatedly fouled by the Kingbury player as I ran down the wing, our linesman flagging continuously. Finally, after resisting 3 or 4 whacks around the shins and ankles I passed the player and was deliberately kicked in the leg. The referee took no action, except to award a free kick. To put the matter into perspective, I have never felt so agrieved in my footballing career that I should retaliate. In this case I picked up the ball and tossed it at the player causing him no harm Nd all referees are of the same calibre nor are all footballers, at all. but I would suggest that referees should not lose control and panic over incidents' and should at least try to protect players who when to incidents a modicum of skill into the game. They should at least have the courtesy to consult their linesmen, reflect upon decisions (because we all make mistakes) and should not talk to team members whilst their opponents take free kicks. The game today would be in a far more healthy state if farmess and skill and not unfairness and brute force was the deciding factor in many matches at all levels.

In conclusion, throwing a ball at a player is an unforgiveable offence, but surely four or five consecutive, deliberate and perhaps maiming fouls on an opponent should not be unheeded. If such dangerous play was dealt with, players such as myself would not take the law into our own hands. Instead of referees reporting that people who throw balls should be send off, perhaps one day they will threaten to send off players who prefer to hack opponents.

I apologise for acquiring this booking, but I wish I had not felt it so necessary to offer some form of retaliation.
