Lea Sports F.C. - First Team Manager's Report 1987-88

Usually, when I read through this report each year it sounds as though I've done nothing but complain about how we could have done better. So, let me say first of all that overall the season was a satisfactory one. We were playing in Division Three instead of Division Five two seasons ago and in the higher cup competitions. We finished the season in a comfortable league position, having achieved some good wins (especially over 61 FC and SKF) and we won some good cup ties, especially over Division One Hexton and over Biggleswade side Kopites in our other cup competition.

In the following round of the Whitbread Cup, however, we met the Cup holders and Premier Division champions Luton Way, who thumped us 10-1. We can take credit from the fact that we were only 1-0 down at half-time, having made some chances ourselves. In the end though, it's the result that matters and that score line will remind us for a long time how much work is still to be done at the Club.

If I had to have one overriding memory of this season, it would be MUD. I seem to have spent so many Sundays this season arriving at Stopsley at 9.15 so that I could wander across the playing areas trying to find something that resembled a football pitch, rather than a swamp. I can still recall standing literally ankle-deep in water on one pitch with a referee who was still in two minds as to whether or not the game should go on. Most mornings (and since our cup games were at home it really was most mornings) it was achoice not between the type of tactics we would use, but the type of footwear - boots or wellies!

Unfortunately (and I know it sounds like sour grapes, but it's true) we are not a side that plays well on heavy pitches. On a good surface we have the players to achieve very good results, such as the 4-1 win away to last season's Division Four champions SKF; the 2-0 win at Wyvern and of course last season's 11-2 win at Luton Town vs. Whitbread. We also won the town 5-a-side plate competition at Luton Town before this season began. On heavy pitches, however, we suffer heavy defeats, such as 0-5 and 1-5 to Luton Flying Club and 0-6 to a very average Brookview Sports.

One of the best aspects of the season for me has been the form of players who have come into the First Team to replace injured players (or those on skiing trips). In particuler, Keith Downing, Pete Mather, Mick Marsh, Ali Stewart, Steve Moorhouse and, letely, Kevin Boxall and Jim Peat have all done well. Unfortunately, this has a knock-on effect on the Second Team and this, coupled with their own lack of belief, has contributed to their demise. What a shame they couldn't have played all season as they did against the First Team (when they won 2-1) and against Markyate and Old Moat House (when even yours truly managed 90 minutes).

I know that before the start of the season I spent two evenings walking round a windy Stopsley selecting possible pitches for us to play on this season. As the players know only too well those pitches did not materialize and it was only later in the season that we began to have the choice of those available. Many players, I know, have been disappointed with the move to Stopsley from the point of view of the playing surface, as witnessed by their recent majority vote in favour of a return to Barnfield. In an Executive Committe meeting shortly after that referendum I voted, along with the other Committee members, for the Club to stay at Stopsley next season. I did so because I know that great efforts have been made behind the scenes to ensure that Lea Sports do get the best possible options at Stopsley and that those, coupled with improved changing facilities and the Clubhouse, will provide the best combination for the future. I have been asked to walk around Stopsley again this summer to select pitches and I shall do so in the hope that the players are not disappointed again next season.

Finally, thanks to <u>all</u> the players who have turned out for the First Team, be it for just one game (even Dave Pymont and John Darley did the business for us!) or all season. I appreciate all your efforts on the pitch (although a few more <u>off</u> the pitch might help) and I am looking forward to winning Division Three next year.

It is with deep regret that I write this report in the knowledge that the second team have finished second from bottom of the league and is so threatened with relegation to Division 7. It is no use anyone making excuses, we have lost games we should have won · by playing badly. No excuses but reasons. We have struggled all season to turn out good teams, indeedon many occassions we have struggled to turn out any side at all. We have seldom played two consecutive games in which we have played the same back four or the same mid field or the same front line and that is no way to run a side and expect to get results. With teams out like that you spend the first half settling down by which time it is often too late. Response from players has varied this year but I would say that the general attitud this year has not been conducive to a good side. It is very difficult to manage a side when you have to ring players up to beg them to play because you are short of players who are willing to play. That last remark may be contentious but success at this level depends on the commitment of the players and this year we have had too many unavailable too often, this situation being aggravated by an exceptional run of injuries. I personally believe that if the second team is to succeed we need to have the right attitude from all signed on players that they want to play for Lea Sports , not just for themselves, at all levels and believe that the success of the second team can only help strengthen the first team and make this an even better club.

The thing I find most disappointing is that all the hard work that went into getting this team p. loted, not an easy job, has now been wasted. Every other season we have been up near the top of the league, indeed for two seasons we were top for something like fourteen weeks each season and just missed out on promotion at the end through injuries forcing the first team to take players. We have had a good record in Division 6 and I feel very sad that we have ended up in this sorry state. Many people will obviously blame bad management for the situation, and if that is the case I have to accept their view. Ihope that next year we can at last get a footballer as manager instead of a pensioned off recond rate rugby player doing a job which nobody else seems to want. I wish whoever manages next year the best of luck and I hope players will rally round and support that person.

Right,off the soap box. Good points. We managed to scrape through to the second round in one of the cups. We have again escaped any bookings and so should be in receipt of another match ball. Thanks. Rick, Steve, Jimmy, Geof, Maurice for their help and support. A very special thaks to Ade for all his help and support throughout a trying season. Kelvin for a good job under difficult conditions as Captain. Ted , the groundsman, and his staff for their efforts during a thoroughly wet winter. Sue and Carol for the food. Mike and the barstaff for the hospitality and service. Anybody else whose name I may have missed but who help me, for which I am most grateful. Lastly Anna for putting up we me, the phone calls the kit and all the other things essential for the running of a team. Announcements.
