Snippets...

Despite what it says in the 'Complete Record' in this magazine, the third team actually started 24 games, not 23, in 1977-78. The missing one was a match against Luton Italian Barbers, played at Pope's Meadow, in which a certain Mick Docherty took exception at being kicked up in the air by one of our tonsorial friends and started a fight which resulted in the match being abandoned. (The score at the time went unrecorded.)

From the minutes of the A.G.M., 14th May 1978:

"Silence and incredulity greeted the announcement that Barry Ainsworth was leading goalscorer (for the second team) but normality returned when the same player had been recorded as being onside for a total of thirteen minutes in one game."

From the same minutes:

"It was a year of four parts: beginning well, a difficult patch due to injuries, shock defeats in the cup, followed by a revival after Christmas and finishing with an indifferent ending."

(I make that five!

From the minutes of the A.G.M., 19th May 1983:

"Rick said he realised how difficult the selection job was and thanked the other members of the committee for their fairness. His apologies went to those "who felt hard done by", but no apology went to those who had been sworn at for lack of effort. His parting shot was, 'When all's said and done, there's a lot more said than done.'"

From the inaugural meeting of L.E.A. Sports, 17th January 1973:

"A Sunday morning get-together for all probables, possibles, improbables and impossibles was arranged for February 4th".

From the minutes of the A.G.M., 15th May 1980:

"Social Secretary's Report.

Mr. Ainsworth said that all he had to do was contact Charlie McNerney about the end of season do. All the social events had been organised by others.

A vote of thanks was proposed to Mr. Ainsworth 'for what he hasn't done'."

From the minutes of an Executive Committee meeting, 2nd February 1985:

"M.Dawson also noted that M.Sunman had lost a contact lens whilst playing for the Club, costing himself £28. Contact-wearing Club members said it was usual to insure contact lenses, hence it was decided to donate £14 to M.Sunman with the advice that he should use it to insure them."

Random Jottings of Maurice Dawson

I was so pleased to read in last year's magazine a number of references to Alan Dawson. But then, being his father I am somewhat biased! I am, however, very pleased that since maturing into a big six-footer he has done so well for the club because it was I who introduced him to the club as a fifteen year old, in a 3rd XI fixture in 1979. I played in that match (result not remembered) and many others with Alan until gradually anno domini took its inevitable toll. Alan rose through the ranks whilst I had nowhere else to go but down

In those far off days of 1979, I could match Alan for speed and usually beat him in a tackle. Neither ability however lasted very long . .

Talking of bygone days, there was a period many years ago when I scored goals for the various clubs I played for as regularly as Alan has for Lea Sports, though I doubt whether he believes me and I'm certain none of your readers who have played alongside me ever will!

And so to some of the inaccuracies in last year's articles . . . I was flattered to get a mention of any kind in the 'Not a lot of people know that' page where it stated, and I quote, "Maurice Dawson started playing in 1977 - he scored his first goal seven years later". Whilst it doesn't really matter very much, both facts are wrong. I estimate that by 1977 I had played 50 - 60 matches for Lea Sports, maybe more, as I moved to Luton in 1973 and, I think, started playing in 1974 or 75. As for not scoring a goal until 1984, I am mortally offended! I can well remember the first goal I scored which was in 1975 or 76 when the then 2nd XI was playing an away fixture against Redbo rne Upper School Staff XI. Quite early in the match, the opposition forced a corner. In true Lea Sports tradition, nobody jumped for it so I did and I can remember to this day the look of startled amazement on our goalkeeper's face as, in attempt to concede another corner by heading over the cross bar, I directed a superb glancing header into the far corner of the net leaving our keeper rooted to the spot in sheer disbelief. I cannot remember his exact remarks but they were something like "you silly little man ". He, the keeper, emigrated to France shortly afterwards'. (True)

I did score a goal in 1984 though, as last year's magazine records, and this time it happened at the correct end of the pitch. I remember it so well. The 3rd XI playing against the VI Form College Staff Team was awarded a penalty and somebody with a warped sense of humour suggested I take it. A mixture of vanity and stupidity caused me to agree. Now taking penalties had never been my strong point and I knew if I aimed for a corner my shot would almost certainly go wide. I therefore decided whilst running up that I would hit the ball very hard straight at the goalkeeper feeling confident that he would only be able to parry the ball and gambling on my ability to nip in quickly and score from the rebound. Not the best ploy for taking penalties I agree - but it worked! I did kick the ball hard straight at the keeper who could only palm the ball back to me, falling over in the process and I did knock in the rebound to score my first 'real' goal for the club!

Next, at risk of boring players who have heard it all before, I feel I must raise the matter of inaccurate match records once again. There are of course glaring inaccuracies in the records shown in last year's magazine. I attach no blame to anyone for this but simply place on record how sad it is that the 2nd XI (or 'Bionics' as they were usually called) fixtures and results in the pre 1977 era were lost. 1977 is, of course, the year in which the 2nd XI is recorded as first having been entered in Division 7 of the North Home Counties League, but there was indeed a 2nd XI long before 1977 which must have played between 50 and 100 fixtures. I recall many happy Sunday

mornings playing matches against such teams as Luton Round Table, Ben's XI, Luton Strollers, St. Albans Round Table, Luton Barbers, Ashcroft High School Staff, Redbo rne High School Staff, Hatfield Apprentices, etc. etc. In the absence of a full fixture list, several fixtures were repeated 3 or 4 times per season and most home ones were played at Lewsey Park. For players like me, who played in many of these early games and have continued on and off ever since still without being credited with the magic 200 award, it is of course particularly significant that all records of these early encounters were lost. I am grateful to the club for awarding me a long service trophy in 1987 but it isn't and never can be quite the same as the award for 200 appearances, to which I know I am entitled but can't have. I know one or two other players who feel the same.

What other memories do I have of my years playing for Lea Sports . . .? There are many, far too many to mention them all, but a few in particular have stuck in my mind. For example, unless you know better, I think I can claim the record for the player to have had most car accidents on the way to a match. I've only had two but they were enough. Back in the late seventies I was driving up Stockingstone Road on a cold and frosty Sunday morning to play for the 2nd team against Ashcroft High School when all the traffic in front of me suddenly stopped on the bend half way up and I couldn't, due to hitting a patch of ice. Hence, one badly damaged Mark 1 Escort, still driveable but looking distinctly battered eventually arrived at the ground. Shortly after the kick off, to make matters worse, I was nearly sent off by Dick Everett the referee, for arguing — truly a day to remember!

A few years later, travelling to another 2nd XI fixture, this time an evening kick off league match against 'the Milkmen' at Bennetts Rec. Dunstable, I had my second shunt. I was in danger of being late for the kick off having been to collect a certain Noel Jenkins, a late replacement to make up the numbers, so I was driving faster than was advisable. In Poynters Road, a child ran out in front of the car ahead of me with absolutely no warning. The lady driver, all credit to her, stopped but once again I couldn't and this time a badly bent Mark 1 Capri arrived at the ground where we duly lost again. A memorable match this was however, as some players will recall. The aforementioned Noel Jenkins, in his one and only appearance ever for Lea Sports, came on as substitute midway though the second half and creased everybody up by giving a loud verbal running commentary of what he was doing every time he received the ball. Fortunately this wasn't very often because approximately ten minutes after coming on, both his legs seized solid with cramp and he was carried off. If ever a player made his mark though, Noel did!

Incidentally, both accidents resulted in an expensive loss of no claims bonus to yours truly, so if the Hon. Treas. has any spare cashlying around . . .!

I've never been sent off — or even booked — whilst playing for Lea Sports — spoken to yes, but never booked. Mind you, there was a time when I should have been . . . It must have been a league game because we actually had a qualified referee wearing proper uniform (and that alone was rare), when the incident occurred in a match at Lothair Road. I cannot remember exactly what the referee's decision was with which I disagreed but disagree I did and commented, albeit quite mildly, "You must be joking ref" whereupon the man in black stopped the match, called Bruce Bonfield over and booked him for dissent! I was so amused and confused, I didn't know what to do so I did nothing. Not at the time anyway, but I hasten to add I did appear at Bruce's appeal and helped get him off.

The longer I sit writing these thoughts the more the memories flood back into my mind, most of them amusing and all of them treasured \dots

I will never forget the look on Dave Pymont's face when he arrived at Icknield High School carrying the suitcase of kit which it had been his turn to get washed, for a 3rd team match, opened it and found the kit filthy and unwashed exactly as it had been stuffed away the previous Sunday thanks to a 'cock-up' by the launderette he had used . . . Likewise I will never forget the looks on everybody's faces on at least two occasions when it had been Geoff Richardson's turn to wash the kit and he turned up with no kit at all!

Never to be forgotten is another stalwart of the club, Dave Jones. Those who played with him will not easily forget his many sterling performances on the field of play but even more priceless were the laughs he gave us all by arriving for games on cold winter mornings with his boots literally frozen solid from the previous week's exertions, necessitating attempts to thaw them out by running hot water over them before he could even get them on! How he escaped pneumonia nobody will ever know.

3rd team players of seasons past will not be surprised to hear Geoff Richardson's name featuring frequently in these 'memoirs'. He was, of course, never known to turn up with everything he needed to play and invariably spent the minutes before kick off cadging tie-ups, shin pads, a jock strap and on one occasion, boots. He will never, I'm sure, live down the occasion he arrived shortly before the end of a game, expecting to play, and totally oblivious of the fact that he should have altered his clock by one hour! Geoff though was nothing if not kind-hearted. He demonstrated this only too well on one occasion following a friendly at Silsoe College when he saw me struggling out of the dressing room carrying nets, footballs, kit and other items (I was manager at the time) and offered to help by taking some of the load out to my car. He duly relieved me of the large coffee flask ${\tt I}$ filled for half-time drinks and whilst I was checking the changing rooms for left items of kit or personal belongings, took it out to my car. What he didn't tell me though was that he had put it immediately behind one of my back wheels, but I found out very soon when a loud explosion accompanied my reversing out of the car park!

When I first played for Lea Sports, the player/manager/captain of the then 2nd team was Glen Pullen, and a very good one he was too. Forced to retire by a back injury when well into his forties, Glen continued to manage the side for a season or two. He will probably best be remembered by the players of that period for his action one Sunday morning at Lothair Road when, following an abysmal defeat, he was so disgusted he chose to go straight home without returning to the dressing room. Unfortunately, he took the valuables bag with him, driving all the way to his home in Flitwick before realising the fact and leaving behind virtually a whole team minus car keys, money and other personal effects. We couldn't even retire to a pub for a drink and when he eventually returned, the pubs were of course long since shut. Glen retired shortly afterwards!

Recalling some of Tony Riley's spectacular own goals whilst playing for the 3rd team makes me laugh now. At the time(s) though I couldn't raise a smile. I mean, we've probably all scored an own goal or two in our careers perhaps with a wrongly directed header from a corner, hitting a sloppy back pass or being responsible for an unfortunate deflection when attempting a last ditch defensive interception with the goalkeeper already well beaten, but none of Tony's could be accounted for in any such mundane way. Oh No! Tony's were in a different league. They were usually full blooded right-footed drives struck ferociously from midway between the penalty area and half way line when Tony found himself in that area of the pitch, facing his own goal and couldn't be bothered to turn round. As the ball arrowed towards the top right or left hand corner of the net beyond the groping fingers and disbelieving gaze of Jimmy Gagahan or some other unfortunate in goal, there always came a strangled

despairing cry of "Jim" as Tony realised the enormity of his 'crime', but it was always far, far too late.

Mention of Jimmy Gagahan reminds me of what I think was probably the funniest incident during my days spent playing for Lea Sports, and it did involve Jim. We were playing De Havilland Apprentices in an away friendly at Hatfield and were losing badly (which was not exactly uncommon) when midway through the second half I picked up a loose ball in our own penalty area, played a perfectly reasonable back pass to Jim, watched him gather it safely then turned to run towards the half way line to play the opposition's centre forward off-side calling out the other back four players as I did so. The next few seconds were pure unadulterated farce. Not hearing the sound of Jimmy kicking the ball out, I turned round, just in time to see Jim hurl the ball straight at the opposing number nine who had strayed off-side. He gleefully side footed it past Jim into the empty net to score the softest goal he'll ever score. This was incident enough but worse (or better) was to follow as Jim bellowed at the top of his voice, "Who the . . . hell's supposed to be marking him then . . .?

In recent seasons, third team players who collected injuries during the course of a game were more often than not attended by Steve Moreton. What professional qualifications Steve was able to utilise when called into service I've never been quite sure about, but I was grateful to him more than once for the sympathy and bandages he handed out with gay abandon, the most recent being when I broke my nose playing in a 3rd team fixture against Oaklands College at Icknield High School. Well I knew I'd broken my nose as it had happened to me once before, but I'm not sure Steve did! His 'treatment' consisted of rolling a length of bandage into a tight little ball and stuffing it up my nostril to stem the flow of blood, muttering concernedly "You'll be alright now, try to forget about it", as he did so. This proved difficult however because as soon as I started running, the ball of bandage began to unravel itself until it dangled down to my waist showering drops of blood with rhythmic ease all over my legs. Fortunately I was wearing red socksat the time! For lesser injuries, Steve's response was always the same. If the injured player was on the ground, Steve would yell from wherever he happened to be "Don't move him!". Once having arrived on the scene though it was a different story. The victim would be hauled to his feet. If he didn't fall down again and could get within three of the correct answer to Steve's question "How many fingers can you see" which accompanied Steve's holding two fingers up squarely in front of his nose, the player would be adjudged as fit to continue. Seriously though in case Steve should ever read this, I don't really mean half of it - he did a great job.

I'm sure all Lea Sports members who have played at 3rd team level would agree that no chronicle of events could ever be considered complete without mention being made of John Scales. The incident in a match against Luton Round Table played at Barnfield when John, annoyed by a 'cocky' player who beat him several times in a 'mickey-taking' manner, attempted to get his revenge by inflicting a truly crunching tackle on the said player is well known. Suffice it to say here that the Round Table player saw John coming a mile off but Tony Riley, standing on the blind side, didn't. The intended victim neatly side-stepped at the last possible moment leaving Tony to take the full force of John's scything tackle. Tony didn't have to be carried off — the tackle itself dumped him yards beyond the touchline and he took no further part in the game. I can't quite remember all of Tony's remarks but seem to remember the words idiot, cretin, dozy bastard and imbecile featured in them somewhere!

Another occasion involving John Scales again in a match against Luton Round Table but this time played at Lancaster Avenue, is however probably not known by any club members other than those who played that day. Not only is it funny but it seems to me it epitomises so much that was good about the spirit in which many third team fixtures were played and that's enough reason for recounting it here. John had only been selected as substitute because he had a date in London which involved an overnight stop on the Saturday preceding the game, and couldn't guarantee being at the ground in time for the kick-off. Not unexpectedly, John was missing at kickoff time and the match proceeded with no Lea Sports substitute on the touchline. After about 20 minutes, Phil Hudspeth took a nasty blow to the head and was advised by a doctor who happened to be playing for Luton Round Table, to leave the field. As Phil none too steadily left the pitch, the familiar figure of John Scales was seen emerging from the pavilion. Responding to shouts from the rest of us, he broke into an ungainly trot and ten minutes later arrived to take Phil's place on the pitch. It wasn't until after the match finished we learnt that John had left his 'companion' asleep, crept out of the house, and made his way to St. Pancras to catch a train to Luton. At Luton station however his troubles began. He discovered he had hardly any money left on his person. Never say die though, John commendeered a taxi driver, told him how much money he had and instructed him to drive as far as the available money would allow in the general direction of Lancaster Avenue Sports Ground. The money ran out near Wardown Park from where John walked the remainder of the way and was 'rewarded' by being able to play immediately upon his arrival. We lost though, again . . !

No football match would of course be possible unless $\underline{\text{two}}$ teams were involved. Whilst these ramblings have drawn attention to many $\overline{\text{of}}$ the 'characters' from Lea Sports it has been my pleasure to play with, other teams have provided equally memorable players and officials. In closing, I remember with fondness just a few of them here.

Pride of place must go to 'Harry' of Luton Round Table - not a player but their referee every time we played them at Lancaster Avenue. Now Harry was a white haired (who am I to talk?) gentleman of mature years who always wore a referee's kit, though most Lea Sports players felt it must be bogus. Although he rarely broke into a trot, he was unfailingly in a good enough position to give off-side decisions against us but seldom felt he was sufficiently well sighted to penalise his own team for a similar offence. The Round Table players, well knowing Harry's 'problem' would usually appeal loudly with a shout of "off-side Harry?" whenever a Lea Sports move looked promising when appraching goal and Harry unfailingly obliged with a blast on his whistle. The mystery was solved once and for all during the last game I played against Luton Round Table when as was so often the case, Harry failed to award us an off-side decision which was quite blatant and from which they went on to score. I complained bitterly at the sheer injustice of it all which, of course, had no effect whatsoever, and I wasn't made to feel much better when one of their team came up to me with a broad grin on his face and said "You're wasting your time chum. I've operated on Harry twice for cataracts in his eyes. He can't see a thing".

Before I'm accused by anybody of sour grapes, let me hasten to add that whilst some of Harry's decisions, or lack of, undoutbedly affected the score line on more than one occasion, they didn't affect the end result which normally reflected the superiority of the Luton Round Table team. Having Charlie Watkins in their side certainly helped their cause too. Charlie, ex Glasgow Rangers and Luton Town F.C. could, even at 60+ years of age make a football do things that most Lea Sports players didn't even dream of.

If we always lost against Luton Round Table however, the balance was certainly redressed whenever we played 'Emerald' F.C. against whom we invariably inflicted crushing defeats, very often taking our goal tally into double figures. Emerald were managed by a wizened, frail looking 55-60 year old who I never knew by any name other than 'Mr. Fountain' and in fact he usually played as well. Mr. Fountain is the only player I've ever met (unfortunately) who literally stepped out of the way when faced by any of our players in possession of the ball. The only contribution he ever made was to 'welly' the ball as hard as he could in the general direction of the opposition's goal when he could reach it without any opponent being within ten yards of him but he usually had to play because Emerald, despite the efforts of the four or five players who did turn up driving around town dragging other players out of bed, rarely fielded a complete team. After the matches, many of which were played at Popes Meadow, Mr. Fountain would be deserted by all his players and be left to gather up kit, footballs and nets, all of which he dumped on a decrepit old 'pram' which he would proceed to wheel off up Old Bedford Road en route for his home near the old T.C..

Then there was the goal keeper for De Havilland Apprentices who played against us a few times. Although in his late teens or early twenties, most six year olds attending my school would match him for maturity as the following two incidents illustrate. Whenever we played this team we were hammered because they were younger, fitter, faster and much better than we were, but the first time we played them we actually scored a goal quite early in the match. A couple of the opposition felt their colleague in goal should have saved the shot and told him so, whereupon the goal keeper threw the most extraordinary tantrum I have ever seen in an adult. He ran off the field shouting and swearing at all and sundry but, of more importance, he took the ball with him and wouldn't let us use it. Some minutes elapsed before a posse of team mates 'coaxed' him to give the match ball back, whereafter he stood on the touchline loudly making fun of all his players every time one of them touched the ball. Quite remarkable you may think and so it was. Would you believe therefore that in the corresponding fixture the following season much the same happened all over again. This time though in his outrageous tantrum, the goal keeper fled with the dressing room keys and literally had to be chased across fields where, screaming with rage, he was eventually persuaded, quite physically, to release them.

We didn't renew this fixture any more .

So many memories remain spanning the years since I first pulled on a 'Lea Sports' shirt. Some of them recorded here could I am sure be matched by players in virtually any football club in the country. Equally however, some I feel could only have happened playing for Lea Sports for it is, in my opinion, quite a remarkable club. What makes it so I have never quite been able to work out. What I do know though is that I have thoroughly enjoyed the fifteen years or so I have been associated with it.

I don't think I will play again for Lea Sports. To make one more comeback with my neck and right ankle being in the state they are would be foolish. May I finally be allowed to express the hope that there will be many other Lea Sports players who, when forced by injury and or advancing years to hang up their boots, will retain a store of happy memories to match my own.
