CHAMPIONS! What a season for the First Team and my first full year as manager.

I think Monday morning for most of the players was welcomed with a massive hangover.

The most miserable games have got to be the two defeats in the league, Wells Star and then FC Houghton. If you ask our Supporter of the Year, **Maurice Dawson**, he will no doubt tell you what a fine referee we had for the latter game. I mentioned Maurice, whose help and support was appreciated by all during the season, but I would also like to mention **Ted Ellis**, who came to the fore during the season, helping and encouraging the team. This will be extended to next season when Ted and I will form the deadly duo, me as Manager and Ted as Coach.

My wife **Sue** has again put up with the commitment on a Sunday and other days that have to be devoted to running a side. I thank her for only clouting me occasionally.

Our training through the season has been excellent and helped not all, but most players level of fitness. This would not have materialised had **Rick** ; not put a lot of effort into setting up this facility.

I would especially like to thank all the players that have crossed my path during the season. I know that most are happy with their season - to those that are not: don't be put off; I pride myself in trying to keep an open mind and try not to draw conclusions from one or two bad games.

Thanks should also go to my Captain, **Alan Dawson**, who has contributed on and off the field to the success of the team. Also **Paul Gatherer**, Vice-Captain, who has given valuable advice.

To finish, I hope that all players will consider playing again next season, because I feel that if the team sticks together then we will have an excellent chance of progressing even further in the league.

It was with great regret that we saw the last of **Mick Marsh** in a Lea Sports shirt. Good luck in your new job, Mick, and I hope you keep up the football, because by Lea Sports' standards you are of course a youngster!

Neil Hebron played in every game but one (when his wife was very inconsiderate and gave birth on a Sunday morning). The improvement in his play has been considerable over the three seasons he has been with the Club. From being a fringe second team player he must now be challenging for a place with the firsts. This has been achieved through hard work and sensible application of advice from senior players: surely a lesson to all.

This campaign has seen the emergence of several young players who look to have a good future with the Club. **Steve Lewis** must be a great asset in goal and I hope that he continues to keep in touch with us. **Andy Sheridan** has been unlucky with injuries, but it is obvious that he has great talent and with better fortune should contribute much to Lea Sports.

Steve Goldsmith has started well and as long as he continues to listen and work hard, his game will progress. **Tom Nolan** still comes under the heading of 'youngster' in this Club and he has turned in many fine performances.

This will be my last season as manager. I will not miss the frequent Friday night and Saturday phone calls to try to patch up a depleted team, or the difficult phone call to someone I have dropped (then the later phone call to say he is in the team again as another player is suddenly unavailable). I will, however, miss the good feelings that can be gained when things go well and the involvement in the running of what is becoming a very successful Club.

I leave a team that has now established itself in Division 5 and has a core of keen and reliable players. Sadly, the average age is still too high and new blood must be introduced, but only if the new player can improve on the performance of the current incumbents. The Club's future is assured, but good results will only be achieved with commitment and hard work; everyone must pull together and encourage each other.

Once again, I would like to thank those officials who have continued to put so much of their time into ensuring the Club's success. Keith Lee and Rick Vipers have helped me immensely throughout, as managers of the First and Third teams respectively. Steve Smith has run Club affairs with his usual efficiency and newer officials such as Phil Thompson, Alan Dawson, Neil Hebron, etc. have made their mark.

Finally, I would like to wish my successor good fortune and enjoyment for 1991/1992. Promotion and cup success are important, but please remember that the reason players give up Sunday mornings is because they love the game.

Winning is wonderful, but not at all costs.

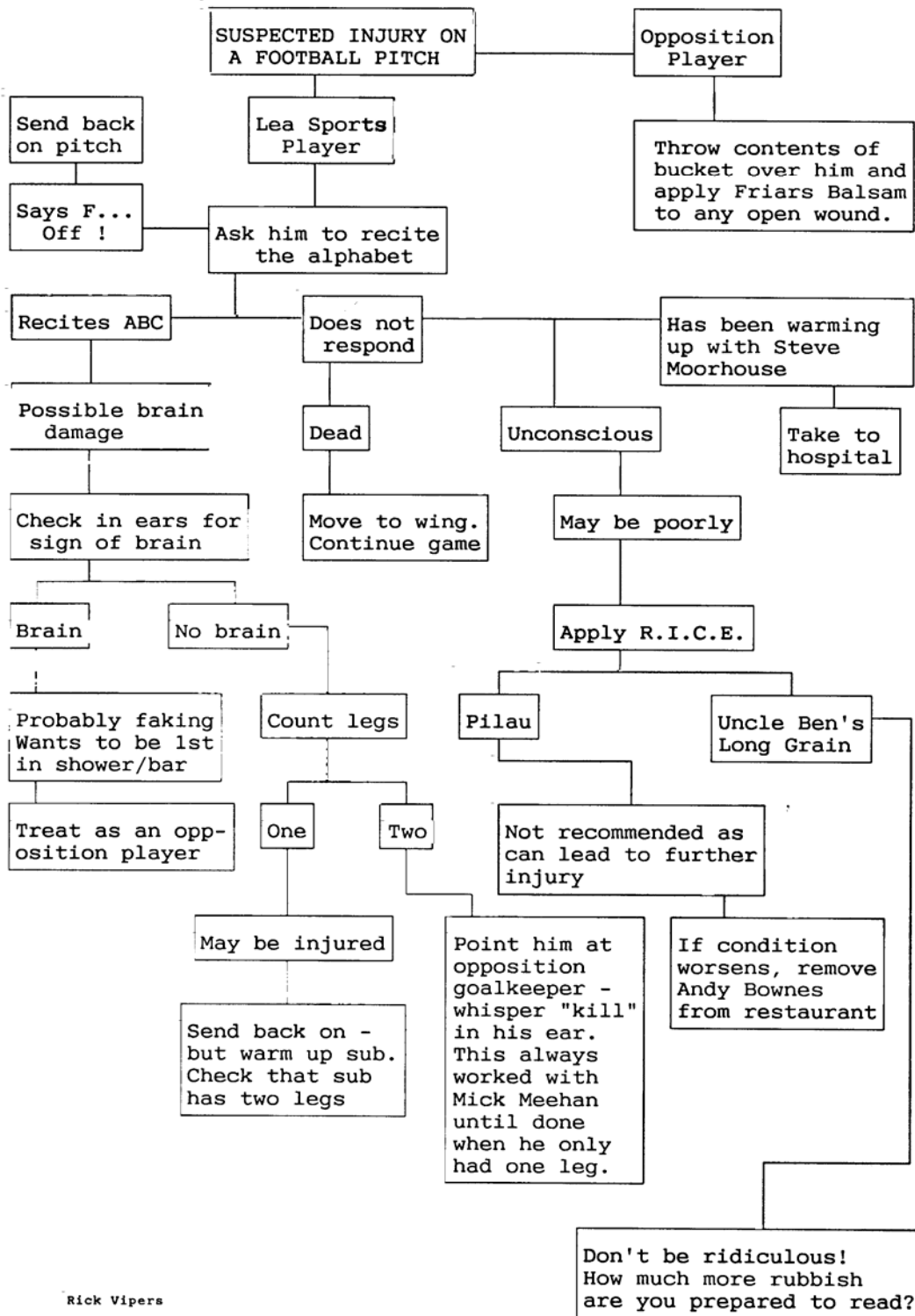
Football Injuries - An Idiot's Guide

Dave Blake - Manager's Memoirs

I write this article as I come to the end of my third and last season in charge of Lea Sports second eleven. It seems an appropriate time to evaluate, reflect on the last three years and look to the future.

For various reasons I reluctantly inherited the team, in some disarray, during October 1988. I was the third manager since the A.G.M. of that year and by the time I officially took charge we were out of one cup and had a league record of one victory, three defeats and a goal difference of 8-21. We could obviously only improve from this point and in the end a respectable league position was achieved.

Last season saw a continuation of our improvement. In a very competitive league we were in the running for a promotion place for much of the season until a disastrous run of one draw and four defeats in five games prevented us from gaining honours.

Prospects looked good for this campaign with several pre-season friendlies and victories in the first two games. However, the season has since fallen away and sadly has seen some very poor performances. While I feel that injuries and players being unavailable at crucial times have contributed to our lack of success, it is obvious that some blame has to be attached to the person in charge and I do accept my responsibilities. Lack of firm discipline has on occasions meant poor starts to several games and team selections have not always proved positive or sensible. It seems that one can run out of ideas and inspiration after a time and three seasons is a reasonable period in charge.

In many ways I will be sad to relinquish the post. I have enjoyed working with all the Officials of the Club and have always felt I have been given great help and support. It has sometimes been difficult to accept the criticism I and my colleagues have received from disgruntled players and, whilst I wish my successor well for the future, I hope he will realise that there are times when any decision he makes will be wrong in someone's eyes. The qualities needed for management in any sphere are numerous but it seems to me that the most important must be a thick skin.

I would dearly have loved to win a trophy in my time in charge and the lack of this must be my great regret. We were never really in contention at the death, but quite clearly the players were and are capable of much more than we have achieved.

Many players have appeared for the second eleven in the past three years and a mention of some of these is now given.

Pride of place must go to **Mark Turner**. Mark has decided that the rest of the players must be 'entertained' on a Sunday morning and he comes to every match with a 'new' joke. It appears that this new joke must be worse than the previous week's and the measure of the man is that he continually achieves his aim. He became a goalkeeper towards the end of my first season in charge and has dedicated himself to success in this new role. The training he has done is quite unique and consists of eating and drinking

everything in sight so that he can fill as much of the goal as possible. I am sure my replacement will be well served by M.T. as his dedication is reaping great results and it is obvious that if he continues his present progress the opposition will have nothing to aim at by the end of next season.

Kelvin Callow is the next player under the spotlight. Many of the opposition have had cause to rue a fifty-fifty encounter with this man of granite and sadly so have several of his team-mates, including myself. I well remember the time Kelvin mistook my head for the ball: at least I remember not remembering where I was for several minutes. Unkind players, notably Keith Lee, have urged this great man to retire, but I say "Carry on Kelvin!" - it's like banging your head against a brick wall, etc..

Steve Moorhouse deserves a place amongst the greats of Lea Sports. His dedication and selfless attitude have proved an inspiration to so many of us. It's amazing to me that he has struggled onto the pitch on so many occasions. True, it sometimes takes him a short while to orientate himself, but once his team mates have pointed him in the right direction he has almost always managed some worthwhile contribution by the half-time coffee and cigarette break.

Charlie McNerney, Steve Close and Peter Conquest come next, as so many have commented on their similar playing styles. The philosophy of these three delicate touch players is "why run when you can't" and this policy has served them well at all times. Playing "to your limitations" has never had such a supporter as Charlie. Some say this is just as well, but I say "Carry on Charlie!" - your deceptive pace will always fool someone.

Many others have served the team well and a player with the legs of **Al Mayman**, the body of **Kelvin Callow**, the head and brain of **Phil Clarke** and the mouth of **Mark Turner** would certainly be worth a place in any team (if the other players could stand the hideous sight!)

Now to the future. It is my great hope that the team continues to make use of its veteran core, but endeavours to introduce young players and encourage them as much as possible. I regret that several good young players have been lost during my time as manager and I wish my successor greater fortune in keeping talent. The best way to do this is of course to produce as good results as possible. This will always inspire new players to see the advantages of staying with a Club with probably the best organisation at this level. It is important that all members support the committee that every member has the opportunity to vote for and that they should try to make themselves available as often as possible because team stability is essential.

Indeed, their record this season of 11 victories is their lowest total of victories in a season since 1983-84 when they won 9 games in Division 5.

They also scored four fewer goals than last season - 70 against 74 - the difference being that this season we conceded 47, not 71. That's the best defensive record since 1986-87 when we were promoted from Division 4.

Overall the team's record is still second to the 1984-85 season (my first season in charge) - 61.1% this season, 65.6% in 1984-85.

The points total too is low for a team at the top of the division. Last season, for example, 28 points would have put us fifth in Division 3 and would not have put us in the top two positions in any of the eight divisions. Division 3 has been a very close division this season, however, with seven points separating the top eight teams, most teams having a positive goal difference and only Holy Ghost being the division's whipping-boys (again!).

Last season, like Lea Sports, Holy Ghost finished second-to-bottom in their division, but they managed three fewer points and their goal difference was -60, whereas ours was -17.

Unlike Lea Sports, however, Holy Ghost were not relegated.

Those of you with long memories may remember that Holy Ghost also finished bottom of Division 3 the season before (1988-89). That year they managed only 2 points and a goal difference of -135. (You may remember that was the year we beat them 17-0 and 7-1).

So in their three seasons in the North Home Counties (all in Division 3), Holy Ghost's record is:

We always said Division 3 was the hardest to get out of!

Talking of relegation issues, many of you will know that last season Lea Sports were one of only two teams in the second-to-bottom place to be relegated (the other being H.R.Chequers from Division 5 to 6). The reason I did not write to the league to ask not to be relegated was because of the assurances we had received, not just from the Harvest Home secretary, who 'knew someone on the Committee', but also from Terry Gilmore, the Chairman of Ashcroft and North Home Counties Executive Committee member who told Bill Hind that we would not

be relegated. As you can imagine, I was a little surprised and annoyed - to say the least - when the constitution of the divisions for this season was announced and we found ourselves in Division 3. Still, our results this season have proved that we were too good for that division.

Our Cup Runneth Over

Here's a quiz question for you.

Which team was eliminated from the Bedfordshire County Cup without having lost a Bedfordshire County Cup game in the County of Bedfordshire? (Answer: Lea Sports)

Confused? So were we. Having drawn our home match with Eaton Ford United we were concerned that the replay was to be played in Cambridgeshire. The Cup Competition Rule seemed quite specific: (quoted here verbatim including underlining)

7. All games must be played within the county boundary and in cases where home grounds are outside, ties will be played on opponent's ground.

Seems fairly clear, doesn't it? But what it actually means is 'grounds which the Beds.F.A. deem to be outside the county boundary', not necessarily those actually outside the county boundary. Still confused? Let me explain - the rule was introduced to stop teams playing their home cup matches in Milton Keynes because it's too far away. You could argue that Eaton Ford is about 10 miles further from Luton than Milton Keynes, but then arguing with the Beds.F.A. never was the most rewarding of activities!

Just a Sec!

As some of you may know I wouldn't watch the first team in their last few matches. I'm not normally superstitious (touch wood!) but over the last two years or so, absolutely everything I've touched has come second. I know the first team finished second-to-bottom last season, but there were many other instances - too numerous to mention - when I've just been pipped. My own record with the first team has not been brilliant this season - I've watched them 12 times and they've won twice. Those two games were against Wells Star (when we lost the first half 1-3) and against Parkside (when we lost the second half 0-3). So I thought it wise to stay away until it was all over.

Small World

Those of you who went on the Paris trip last May might remember our meeting with a Lea Sports old boy. On one of the days our guide was unable to accompany us and arranged for a replacement to come along as a favour.

The replacement when he arrived turned out to be Mick Barnfather who played 13 games for the Club in 1980-81, but who now lives in Paris. Luckily we had some spare copies of last year's

magazine with us and we were able to show him his name in print!

The trip itself was, I am sure, enjoyed by all who went, despite the results of the two games. Imagine how we felt when we turned up for the first match at a 2,000-seater stadium - not quite Stopsley on a windy Sunday morning. There we were with no recognized goalkeeper and a mixture of our three teams against a side who had reached the last 32 of the French F.A.Cup. I thought we did well to keep the score down to 10-2 - and we did score two very good goals!

I remember afterwards talking to the French captain and someone asking him if they had played against any other English teams. He replied, "Yes, last season. What were they called...? Ah, yes..Nottingham Forest!" Apparently, they had beaten the Forest Colts side (with two first teamers) 2-0. So perhaps we didn't do too badly.

As you can imagine, after this we approached the second game with some trepidation, especially since the hangovers were getting worse as the weekend progressed. Once again the stadium was impressive, with floodlights and a big grandstand. Briefly, we lost 6-0, but I'm sure that the full first team would have given them a good game.

They did appreciate our ability to enjoy ourselves, however, (probably because of Hugh's rugby songs) and we were invited back for another visit. Having been unofficially elected as 'group interpreter' I was sorry to have to be the one to break up the party and get everyone back on the coach.

At least we showed that English football teams abroad are not all complete lunatics and I hope the Dusseldorf trip is as successful.

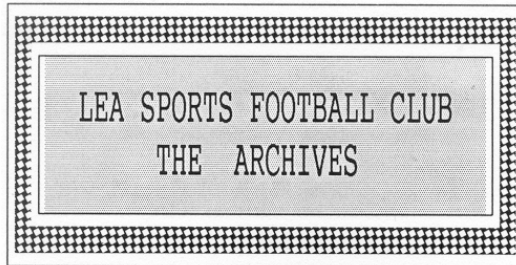
