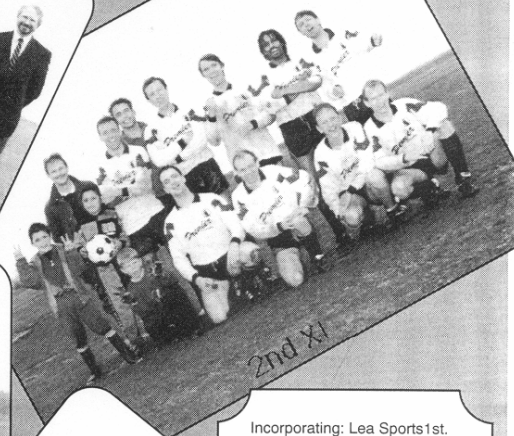

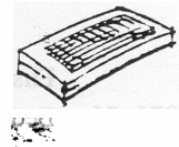

Chairman's Report

This season has provided some memorable events, some good and some not so good.

Kelvin Callow playing his 500th game for the Club: there must be very few individuals or Clubs that can boast of a player having achieved this. I believe Kelvin is playing as well now as when I first arrived at the Club and I hope to be able to celebrate his 600th game.

Some of us have long had doubts about whether a player could manage the First Team and play. Kev Boxall will be the first to admit that he did not have the greatest start to the season and the managerial learning curve was a very steep one. I have been impressed with the time, effort, energy and thought that Kev has brought to the post. It is extremely pleasing that the First Team's final league position reflects all this hard work. It should be noted that Kev has continued to run the side very successfully despite breaking his leg in January. I am certain that all would wish Kev well and I hope that he will continue next season. A special thank you to all the players who have supported him.

Neil Wilkinson has had probably the hardest managerial job to do and early in the season had a good deal of success. It is he who is left to pick up the pieces of a depleted team and has done incredibly well to field a side at all times. Special thanks should be recorded to Neil for the number and quality of players he has introduced to the Club.

John Pawley saw the Third Team get off to a very poor start in the league, but gradually pick up to the point where early season form became a real regret. A cup final place and to be losing semi-finalists go to highlight the very great improvement in Third Team fortunes. The introduction of players like Willy O'Leary, Scott Brown, Dave Bateson and the greatly-improved Bobby McGrath, Steve Baggett and Hugh Byrne has meant that the Third Team really do look like a winning unit.

Al Mayman was a reluctant manager and had stated that he had not enjoyed the start of the season. However, the second half of the season, like most of the other sides has proved to be far more successful and Al enjoyed it far more. Al was picked for a Third Team fixture and commented on how good it was simply to be able to turn up and play. I know Al would rather just play and do the other Committee work he enjoys, but very unselfishly he agreed to manage a side. Lea Sports are indebted to him and those others like him who take on a job (and do it well), when everybody else is reluctant to step into the breach and the success he has had is a welcome bonus.

Unknown to most is the great success of the Monday 5-a-side team. They are pre-season Tournament champions, League Cup runners-up and finished with a very creditable league position. Well done lads!

This season has seen a change of name to Lea Sports Stopsley F.C. and a number of youth teams playing as part of the Club. Like our adult teams they have had mixed fortunes, but all play the game and are managed in the manner in which the Club has been founded. Kieran Dimambro has led his side to runners-up place in the league - Congratulations! Jim Hughes sees his side finish this year as they become available for adult football and it will be good to see some of his players (Scott, Dave, Pete, Sean) add strength to our adult sides next year. Jim was an advocate of the youth sides playing under a Lea Sports banner and has always been extremely supportive. Although Jim retires from his managerial duties this year I know he will be a regular visitor to matches and we look forward to seeing him on the touchline. Dave O'Dell took over the Under Thirteens early on in the season and has done well and we hope that Mark Douglas will stay with the Club next year to run an Under Ten team.

Off the pitch we have had mixed blessings. Paul Gathern has run the Entertainments, assisted by Steve Close and resident barman Pete Mather. A big thanks to all those who have supported the events this season; if you are one of those who has NOT supported the events perhaps you will next season!! It is worth saying "if you want good kit, etc, etc....." and if you don't know how much it costs to play a home fixture ask someone who does (The Treasurer) - you will be surprised.

I always seem to end on the same note! Any 11 people can pick up a ball and go play football. However, for that same 11 people to form a Football Club is quite a different matter. In order to run the Club a great deal of effort has to be put in; ask Steve Smith, Paul Gathern or any of the managers. The more people that get involved in doing a little bit, the lighter the load for everyone and the more effective we become as a Club.

At the end of each season I sit down and write a report and it gives an opportunity for reflection over the season that has just ended. Although this reflection is a valid exercise, what's gone is gone and we should concentrate on the future and the coming season.

It was Peter Sellers who, when asked "What are you doing there?" replied "Everyone has to be somewhere !!!". This is our 20th year, we have a past to be proud of, but what of the future? If we do nothing then we will doubtless end up somewhere, but from a personal point of view I would rather us be master of our own destiny. I feel that the coming season needs to be the one where we define an agenda for the future development of the Club, I would like all members to help shape that future.

And finally....a thank you to this year's committee who I think have probably been one of the best. However, we all acknowledge that there is a great deal to do and I hope the 93-94 committee will go on to even greater things.

First Team Manager's Report

My first season in charge, as player-manager and so many things to write about, both good and bad. Our highest position ever: fourth, by a Lea Sports team so close to promotion and a firm basis set for next season.

As the saying goes, "football is a game of two halves" and that is how our season went. Defeat in both cup competitions in the early rounds, six points from our first eight league matches and third from bottom of Division Two by Christmas. From January to March we then proceeded to gain 14 points from a possible 18 and put ourselves in a position to challenge for promotion for the run-in during April. Unfortunately inconsistency in our performances finished any chance we had of promotion.

On 25th April we met AFC Wigmore in our last game of the season knowing that a point would secure Division One football next year. However, despite total domination from the first minute, we failed to score, and from a free kick in the 90th minute Wigmore scored from only their third shot at goal throughout the game.

I will never forget the look on the players' faces or the feeling of utter disappointment afterwards. However, it has to be said that failure to secure points earlier in the season meant it was going to be an uphill struggle. Despite a great run from the middle of January, defeats against Borough Arms, AFC Heron Reserves and Luton Way Totternhoe Reserves during February and March cost us promotion. Players must realise that a championship is won from September to April and that in Division 2 no game is easy. You have to perform for the whole 90 minutes and if we had maintained the attitude and commitment shown against Swan away and Luton Way at home then success would have been ours.

After our 5-2 defeat by Luton Way away (after beating them 3-0 at home the previous week) I heard a player comment, "Oh well never mind, there's always next year". It is this attitude which raised its ugly head in games we had to win. You cannot rely on favours from other teams. This is seen by the fact that after losing to Heron and Luton Way they both proceeded to lose their last two matches and give us some hope. However, we had already contrived to make it all the more difficult.

On the plus side, the performances of Gavin Campbell and John Temple when brought in were very pleasing. My two captains during the season, Kevin Connolly and Mick Justin deserve much credit for their all-round work and commitment, both on the pitch and with selection duties with me off it.

I have to hold my hand up to mistakes I made during the season, which were mostly concentrated while I was trying to play and manage before January. After my injury my job became that much easier as it was easier to see problems and solutions to them.

My thanks go to all the players I called upon and to those not selected: you were noted, but selection is never an easy task. Having used at least 25 players this season, many of them prior to January, I was then able to select a regular 14 and I'm sure those not kept would agree that when a side goes undefeated for seven matches out of nine, making changes is not always a good idea.

Thanks to Steve for his regular and accurate updates, as always a job very well done. Thanks to Al, John and Neil for putting up with me at selection meetings. Thanks to Jim for his co-operation at training and sincere thanks to Ted Ellis and especially Maurice for their touchline support all season.

I took this job with much enthusiasm and determination. I shall be standing again next year and, if elected, will continue with that all-round commitment. I will be burying myself in the role as manager, hopefully for many years, as after a second opinion I will never play again. To all those who helped me as a player - Maurice, Bill, Steve, Keith, my sincere thanks.

Finally to the team. This is a great Club. Bring your mates along next season and let's finish the job we started this year. To future Champions!

Second Team Manager's Report

When I first came to write this report, I thought it would be straightforward. We've finished 6th out of 12 in the league, winning 8 games, losing 8, drawing 4 and losing in all three cups in the first game – an even season. The reasons would be obvious: the defence had played well, but we hadn't scored enough goals. But it wasn't like that. Have a look at the table to see what I mean. We've scored more goals than the teams finishing 4th and 5th, letting in only two more goals than Wells Stars, but still got 6 points less than them. We've had 6 close games against the top 3 teams, but lost them all.

The thing we haven't done this year is score goals at the right time. Virtually everyone has played alongside Phil Clarke up front, but although Phil has scored goals again this year, there hasn't been a successful combination. Not taking relatively easy chances at important times has meant games lost by a goal, games drawn instead of won. I should know.

There are a few people I'd like to mention, but I don't know what we'd have done without them. Marcus Tyler has had a tremendous first season with the Club. The defence has been solid for most of the year and it was no coincidence that we lost 2 games to teams we should have beaten when Marcus wasn't available.

I'm sure Pete Mather would join me in thanking Dave Newman for playing in goal, to allow him to play on the pitch. A good keeper is essential for any successful team and both Mark Turner and Pete have contributed greatly by going in goal when needed.

So after 8 months what are the things I remember most about the season? The weather. We had a lot of matches postponed due to flooded pitches. The trek round Stopsley to try to find a pitch we could use meant that things did not always run smoothly on a Sunday morning.

In October, I remember we were losing 3-0 in the Cup with half an hour to go. We came back to 2-3, then Rick Vipers headed the equaliser in injury time. But no; the ball went through the net. The goal wasn't given. We lost 3-2.

In November, we played Sacred Heart Reserves, then at the top of Division One, at Vauxhall on a perfect pitch with lots of room. The records say we lost 3-0 in the Reserve Cup, but I think that was the best we played. We matched them for everything except finishing. One-nil down with 10 minutes to go, I took off a defender and put on a forward. Two more goals finished us off, but nobody outplayed us all year. (Sacred Heart Reserves went on to win the Reserve Cup).

The only other thing I can remember is one of the best saves at our level. It was in March and Dave Newman somehow managed to hurl himself half way across his goal to save a point-blank shot, low down in the corner. I wish I could remember the game.

also wish I could remember all those funny things that have happened during the season, when everyone says "That will be in the end of season report". Perhaps someone can remind me.

Finally though, thanks to Archie Conway and Rick Vipers for all their support, help, advice, motivation and organisation during the year, which I couldn't have managed without. I'm very pleased that Neil Wilkinson has taken on the job for next year. Perhaps next year we'll win something.

Third Team Manager's Report

The end of another season is again upon us. I would consider this to have been one of the most inconsistent seasons I have ever been involved in. When the team played well it was very good, but when we were bad it was horrific.

The culmination of the season was our appearance in the Steve Smith Trophy Final, which we eventually lost 2-0 to Norman King. The team played well in defeat, controlling the majority of the game, but unable to convert the chances that fell to them. Norman King had few chances but managed to convert two of them.

Manager's player of the year is Kelvin Callow for his dedication and commitment - a model to all players.

Finally, thanks to Dave Blake, a solid, reliable Captain; to Steve Smith, who does all the hard work behind the scenes; and to all involved with the Third Team.

Secretary's Report

It's been what you might call a busy season. A few facts to begin with: the adults played 99 matches, winning 36 and losing 48. They scored 237 goals (4 less than last season) and conceded 260 (65 more than last season). Of course this year we have run four league teams for the first time and it is a great credit to the managers that we fielded full teams for all but one or two matches.

Talking of managers, a personal word of encouragement and respect for Kev Boxall. As Mark Turner mentioned in his report, one or two people were unsure of the wisdom of electing a player/manager for the First Team, especially one who had no previous experience of running a side. Early results did not go in Kev's favour and there were some rumblings in the ranks. Then Kev broke his leg playing in the win over Wigmore. A broken leg is bad enough at the best of times, but this was a particularly nasty break with complications. Since then Kev has been in and out of hospital and as I write is still undergoing treatment for infection of the wound. Most people faced with such problems would have left the running of the team to someone else and got on with their own life, but throughout all of this Kev has given his all for the good of the team, with the deserved results. I know how I felt at 38 when I had to come to terms with the fact that I couldn't play any more – even now on a pleasant April evening I think how nice it would be to pull on a pair of boots and just kick about with the rest. So for Kev at 26 it must be an even more crushing blow. All I can say is that the way he has responded and dedicated himself to the Lea Sports cause is a great credit to him as a person and a great bonus to the Club.

The ending to the season was disappointing for all four adult teams – the First XI going down to that late goal against Wigmore; the Second XI finishing as they started, with a defeat against Roman Legion; the Third XI losing the Steve Smith Memorial Trophy Final (no relation!) in what was Lea Sports' 150th Cup tie; and the Fourth XI only being able to field a Fourth VI and having to concede their final Cup match vs. Barn Owl B.

Overall, however, the adults' season has run quite smoothly from an administration point of view. Most players don't realise that they actually compete in two leagues. In the North Home Counties they also compete for the Fair Play Award, based on points for administrative fines, bookings and sendings-off. I'm happy to say that we've had another fine-free season for the adults, but stupid bookings and dismissals for arguing with referees has probably cost us the Fair Play Trophy and the £50 award. Also, I should remind players that each team which has a perfect discipline record receives a new match ball from the Beds.F.A., so again it's something to think about when you're chasing after a referee just to call him a name. I know some of the referees we have to put up with would try the patience of a saint (more about this later), but please remember that a booking or a sending-off for swearing at a referee achieves nothing, costs you and the Club money and prestige. Enough said.

This season has been my first experience of youth football and the delights of the Chiltern Youth League. The pre-season portents were all good – a well-organised AGM, divisions from Under 18 to Under 10 and a regular publication (the 'Goalpost') given out each month. Unfortunately, the actual organisation of the fixtures is a disaster! It seems as though teams can call off matches when they feel like it, referees are unreliable and the information from League officials is scant.

Again, the facts: the youth teams played 73 games, winning 18 and losing 50. They scored 137 goals and conceded 296. The fortunes of the individual teams varied widely however and it's worth looking at them individually.

The Under 18's, under Jim Hughes, were well-organised, attended training and deserved better than a division with only seven teams in it. On top of that, clubs like Hitchin Town and Royston Town seem to be a law unto themselves and play matches when they feel like it. Don't forget, each team has just 12 league games to play, but at the time of writing (3rd May) Royston still have two games to play. Ridiculous! Also, it is a great regret to me that Hitchin Town emerged as champions. Having watched the match at Hitchin under floodlights I can honestly say that I have seen few more aggressive teams in 15 years. Of course a will to win and a passion for the game are essential for success, but the raw aggression displayed by the Hitchin team is not good for the game and, I'm afraid, not good for those players. Some of them were very skilful, but unless that skill is properly channelled, they will never make it as players. I think the Hitchin management has a lot to answer for.

Moving on - the Under 17's had a difficult start to the season - and then things got worse! Mark Douglas has struggled manfully to get teams out, but when he has 13 players at 10 a.m. and only 10 by 2 p.m. there's not much he can do. I feel sorry for the four or five players who have stood by him all season and have been let down by the others. In the end, not just because of the bad weather, but also because of a division in which 10 teams played each other 3 times (compared with the Under 18's) they were left with many midweek games through April and May and the decision was taken to fold the team. I just hope some of the keener players will stay with us and get the chance to play adult football.

The Under 15's, by comparison, recovered from their poor start and attracted new players, allowing them to finish as runners-up. Having been the only team to beat champions Sundon Park (and twice at that!) I'm sure they're disappointed that earlier results prevented them from taking the title.

The Under 13's also recovered from an unhappy start and a change of manager. Gradually they found their feet in the higher division, having won promotion last season. However, like the Under 17's, they too have suffered from too many fixtures (26 league games in total) and having to play 2 or 3 league games a week has taken its toll at the death.

What has been interesting has been the level of integration between Lea Sports and the former Stopsley Boys Club. Having watched all eight teams at some stage I found that the managers of the adult teams would still shout, "Come On, Lea Sports!", whilst the youth team managers would still shout, "Come On, Stopsley!". Somewhere in the middle was dear old Kieran who at one game shouted, "Come On, Stopsley!" and then seeing me watching, added, "Oops, sorry...Lea Sports!".

Behind the scenes it has been a busy time. As some of you know, we have struggled hard, but in vain to find a better playing surface for the First Team. Frankly, the standard of the pitches at Stopsley has deteriorated over the last 2 or 3 years, despite the efforts of Ted Lindsay and his ground staff, whose hands are tied most of the time. The poor state of the pitches puts a damper on all of the efforts we make to build a future at Stopsley. I don't think the actions of the Social Club's management helps either. Recently Lea Sports were accused, after 20 years of collaboration with the TC, of being a "law unto themselves". All I can say is that the people who levy such criticisms should put their own house in order first. The letter containing that accusation is still the only official (or unofficial) correspondence I've had from the TC management. No minutes, no notices, no rules, no constitution - no idea!! (I suppose somebody will read this and have a go at me, but if the cap fits....). The current loose amalgam of TC, Squash Club, Lea Sports (and Ashcroft?) fails to make the best use of what is available. As with the European Community, the logical answer is closer union with a single structure - but would you be the one to sign away Lea Sports' independence to the local equivalent of the Brussels Bureaucrat?

Talking of things that annoy me, I really ought to reserve a special mention at this point for one or two referees we've had the misfortune to come across this season. Actually, four in particular stick in my mind. Firstly, there's Mr.C.Walsh of Barton. He was the referee last season who booked Colin Bradley in the cup match vs. Black Swan. I was on the touchline for that match and I know the booking was unjust and brought about by Walsh's inability to read a match. Unfortunately, he did it to the reserves again this season. This time I was running the line and I would guess that I gave about a dozen offsides. Of these he'd have given free kicks for about 3, overruled about 3 and not even looked at me for the other 6. His victim this season was Keith Lee, who was booked more for sheer frustration than anything else. That's two match balls in two seasons that Walsh has cost us - a man who can't even control his kids before the game without shouting his head off.

The second is Mr.M.Williams. Before the Under 17 match vs. Flamstead, he was telling me how 'shattered' he was. It was his fourth game in two days and he'd been working late Saturday night. My heart bleeds! During the match, he failed to notice a ball that had gone out for a throw, Flamstead scored and as a result of the ensuing protests we had one player sent off and one booked. I'm afraid some ref's just look at these fixtures as a 'nice little earner' (and the football comes a poor second).

The third is Mr.A.Paul. A few weeks after ruining our Second Team match vs. Kenilworth Rangers he was at it again, this time booking one of the Under 13's. Another ref completely out of tune with what is going on around him.

Last, but not least, is Mr.Bernard Thompson. You will remember him as the man who sent off Ali Hearn two years ago (after which Ali decided that lying in bed on a Sunday morning was better than putting up with the Thompsons of this world - and who can blame him?). Unfortunately, Thompson is the Referees' Secretary of the Luton Sunday League and as such appointed himself as referee of the aforementioned Steve Smith Trophy Final.

From the second minute, when Russ Sheppard was clattered in the back of the head, Thompson happily wandered about in his own little time zone (about 10 minutes behind the rest of the world). As a direct result of his incompetence a foul on Willie O'Leary near the end of the game developed into a brawl and to cut a long story short, Hugh Byrne was sent off and the game restarted...with a free kick to Norman King! This man should not be allowed to referee football matches. He causes more trouble than he prevents, but more than that he actually makes players and officials feel that it's not worth taking part any more. Right - moans over. (No doubt someone will read this and have a go at me, but if the cap fits....)

A quick mention at this point of matters financial. Running eight teams is an expensive business and we owe a great vote of thanks to our sponsors, Premier Computer Supplies, who continue to support us season after season. I hope that members and friends will justify that support by putting business Premier's way whenever possible. If you have any computer or office requirements, give Hugh Byrne a ring on Luton 572727 (and mention Lea Sports!).

Our other major source of income is our fundraising efforts, which again I would urge you to support. As well as the Premier League forecasting competition, which runs every year, we have just introduced the Lea Sports 100 Club, which should provide important revenue to the Club in coming years. Please support the fundraising and social events. They are there not just for your entertainment, but for the little luxuries in life (free training at the Brache, kit, footballs, pitches, referees, etc.)

LEA SPORTS HIT CHINA!! No, not late Tour news, but a recognition of the fact that this year marks the twentieth year since Lea Sports were founded (their 'china' anniversary). A look at the League Tables for 1973-1974 will show that there are not many Sunday clubs who are still around after all that time and it is a great credit to those involved that the Club is still growing and continuing to achieve better and better league placings. Over the years many people have taken part in this development, but a few names stick in the memory. Firstly, Jeff Taylor who was the original elder statesman at the Club and ran committee meetings like school staff meetings, frequently telling members off for bad behaviour! Phil Holmes, obviously a Forest fan, was always one who cared as much about the way we played as the result. Dave Pymont and Phil Clarke who between them have scored almost as many goals as Kelvin Callow has appearances. Keith Lee who has served this Club loyally in many capacities on and off the pitch. Dave Blake, Maurice Dawson, Bill Hind, Al Mayman, Mark Turner..... I could go on. My only regret is that, with a few notable exceptions, more of these elder members take no active part in current Club affairs. Part of the problem again lies in the division between the TC and Lea Sports: people think that being a member of Luton Teachers' Social Club means that they are still a part of Lea Sports, but in practice this is of no benefit to us. Indeed, it saddens me when two of the four TC committee members who convened the meeting to chastise Lea Sports for their lack of commitment to the common cause (as I mentioned above) were ex Lea Sports players. I only hope that many of the former members have turned up to the Awards Evening and that they will stay in touch and maintain an interest in Lea Sports' future.

And what of the future? Lea Sports continues to achieve notable milestones, from Kelvin Callow's 500th appearance, to Phil Clarke's 400th appearance and 300th goal, the Third Team's 100th League match, the Club's 150th Cup match, for the Under 13's Robert O'Dell's 100th goal since joining Stopsley Boys, over 1,400 matches, over 3,000 goals... Next season will see another step forward with Saturday football for Lea Sports and (hopefully) an Under 10 team. I hope that in not so many years from now not only will the First Team be challenging St. Josephs for the North Home Counties Premier League title, but that the Under 10's will be challenging them for that title also.

It takes a lot of hard work and dedication to the cause, on and off the pitch. When, as secretary in 1982-83, I compiled the first of these annual magazines for the Tenth Anniversary, I finished with the sentence, "May the Club continue to prosper and may its tradition continue for many years to come!" Well, those ten years have gone by in a flash and the Club is well poised for successes unimagined at that time. Who could have foreseen, when a few teachers got together in a bar in 1973 to form a football team, that 20 years later a Club of nearly 200 members would be one of the best respected Sunday sides in the county.

Here's to the next twenty years.
